With more than 30,000 new international citizens each year, Greater Copenhagen is an attractive career destination for professionals who are looking for the Scandinavian lifestyle. This is for the benefit of both Danish companies and universities, who are looking for highly skilled workforce and talent today.

International Citizen Days brings together a broad range of companies and organisations in a one-of-a-kind welcome event, ensuring a good talent reception and hopefully also a long-term talent retention. The event is part of 'Welcome September, a national welcome month in Denmark, and co-funded by The European Social Fund and the Danish Board of Business Development.

International Citizen Days 2024 took place in Øksnehallen in the heart of Copenhagen on 27-28 September, revolving around the topics of housing and banking, job and career and culture and leisure through carefully curated talks, debates, workshops, activities and a large fair, giving all participants the chance to meet and connect with relevant organisations and gain valuable knowledge in a 'hyggelig' informal setting.

Mayor of Culture and Leisure in Copenhagen, Mia Nyegaard, and Mayor of Employment and Integration in Copenhagen, Jens-Kristian Lütken, welcomed everyone on Friday with official welcome speeches, which also took place on Saturday with Mia Nyegaard welcoming visitors followed by communal morning singing with Rytmisk Center. Both days were moderated by Nivedita Eskesen.

This year was the sixth year of International Citizen Days. The very first event took place in 2019 and lasted for one day. In 2020, the event lasted for three days, though virtually due to Covid 19. Since 2021, the event has grown larger in both scope and turnout, focusing more and more on job and career in addition to housing, banking and social life.

TALKS, ACTIVITIES AND A CAREFULLY CURATED FAIR

Participating in International Citizen Days 2024 was free as always, and the event was open to everyone. The event lasted for two days with Friday revolving around job and career with a total of 80 available stands representing relevant companies and organisations of all sizes as well as talks taking place simultaneously. Saturday offered a total of 117 stands with help and guidance on everything from housing, banking, career opportunities, education, tax, childcare, volunteering to culture and leisure activities among many other things.

A total of 30 talks hosted by experienced professionals provided participants with valuable information on the Danish tax system, Danish traditions, entrepreneurship, job hunting, housing market, workplace culture, networking, buying real estate, sustainability, volunteering, sports, and living an active and engaged life. People outside of the country considering Denmark as a career or study destination could also take part in the event by joining the main stage digitally, as a total of 9 selected key talks were live streamed directly from Øksnehallen.

Participants had the chance to explore and learn about their new city and region in fun and creative ways as well as try their luck at the always popular wheel of fortune with great prizes. They could play basketball, dance salsa, watch fencing or release their inner creativity in a recreational culture and leisure zone. They could also take part in the unique Café Curious and learn from other internationals who were once newcomers themselves in meaningful 1:1 conversations on everything from student life and job hunt to learning the language and cultural barriers.

A total of 6,899 international citizens (+1,133 accompanying children) signed up for International Citizen Days 2024, which was once again this year an unforgettable experience for everyone taking part.

International Citizen Days is organised by International House Copenhagen (part of the Culture and Leisure Administration in the City of Copenhagen). The house was established in 2013 with the objective of strengthening the reception and retention of international talent including their accompanying families with a one-point entry. International House offers many relevant events for international citizens each year. The events are all hosted in collaboration with external parties such as cultural institutions, private companies, and public authorities.

METHODOLOGY FOR EVALUATION

When registering for the event, all participants completed a questionnaire. In addition to this, both participants and exhibitors received an email shortly after the event had taken place, asking for feedback through an evaluation form consisting of questions about both the event form and content of the event.


The design of the evaluation form was based on previous event evaluations, which International House Copenhagen has many years of experience with. All data was collected via SurveyXact, a digital questionnaire system, from which relevant comments were selected to emphasise the results. A total of 6,899 participants registered for the event (3,247 on Friday and 3,652 on Saturday), answering a questionnaire in this connection. A total of 471 participants and a total of 56 of 158 exhibitors subsequently completed an evaluation form, which forms the basis of this report.






How did the participants know about the event?








How long have they been in Denmark?





Denmark – and Greater Copenhagen in particular – is an attractive career destination due to worldclass research environments, facilities, and laboratories together with excellent opportunities for collaboration with companies within the region's highly competitive industries.

Furthermore, Denmark offers a high work-lifebalance and a unique workplace culture characterised by a low hierarchy, small income gap and social safety nets.

Friday's focus was on job and career, offering interesting talks and a carefully curated fair. Students, jobseekers, and employees had the chance to visit plenty of stands with consulting and recruitment companies and attend talks on career strategies, entrepreneurship, CV workshops and salary negotiations. In addition, a career matchmaking event took place where job seekers and 7 companies with specific vacancies had the chance to meet and talk through 1:1 interviews after a careful selection process. With a total of 391 applicants, there was a massive interest in participating in the matchmaking event. 39 candidates were selected for individual interviews, which resulted in 15 follow-up job interviews and 18 expected hires.

Saturday focused more on professional networking and Danish workplace culture as well as guidance on job and career in the fair.

Both days offered the chance to participate in Café Curious, where participants could learn from other international citizens who had chosen to live and pursue a career in Denmark.

Finding suitable accommodation is one of the biggest challenges for international citizens in Greater Copenhagen. This is partly due to the general pressure on the housing market in Copenhagen, but also because international citizens tend to lack a network and knowledge of the housing market to help them navigate in it.

The banking sector can also be quite a challenge when moving to another country - especially the complex tax system. To help international citizens wrap their head around housing and banking, Saturday offered engaging talks and useful information on for example rental regulations, mortgages, insurance, types of tax and the Danish pension system.

But it is often easier said than done and can be quite challenging to make new friends or find suitable activities, if you do not know where to look.

It is therefore no surprise that culture and leisure is one of International Citizen Day's key topics - only expanding year after year. The fair itself offered the chance to meet a broad range of organisations of all sizes within culture and leisure such as sports clubs, libraries, culture houses, museums, conversation clubs and volunteer platforms, where participants could learn about the organisation, how to become a member and explore their offers. Moreover, there were exciting talks on how to get started using the countless cultural institutions and sports clubs in the City of Copenhagen.

Another way to connect with others is through speaking and while English can certainly get you far in Denmark, it is always fun to learn a new language and a good idea to learn Danish. Multiple language schools offered information about their courses as well as a first taste of the Danish language in fun and engaging ways.

A coherent recreational culture and leisure zone was again this year a popular meeting point for libraries, culture houses and international families, who could meet, talk, and inspire each other while children could engage in fun activities like painting, drawing and badge-making.









International Citizen Days 2025

This is the sixth year of International Citizen Days, and each year the event has only grown and improved due to the valuable feedback collected.

Following International Citizen Days in 2019 and 2020, participants asked for a stronger focus on the topics job and career, specifically wanting to meet more companies and organisations within this field. Based on this, the programme was adjusted in 2021, dedicating the entire first day of the event (Friday) to job and career, which has been received well and expanded since.

There is, however, still room for improvements as collaborations with companies looking for international talent can be strengthened even further. In order to meet participants' wishes to talk to more potential employers at the event, more companies from different industries need to take part in International Citizen Days in future. Also, there were quite a few participants who asked for more information on youth education such as high schools and universities.

The overall satisfaction with the programme including the three topics represented was again this year very high among both participants and exhibitors.

Several exhibitors commented that they had many visitors, who were interested in exploring their services further. Numerous exhibitors also expressed that they were very happy with the number of new subscribers to their newsletters after the event.

Many participants expressed that they were very happy with the number of activities taking place. Some did, however, comment on the fact that the programme was packed with many overlapping talks, making it hard to choose as well as they would have liked the event to last longer. The following comments from participants provide some impressions from the event.

"Nicely set up, I've found it easy to find the booths and talks I was looking for. I like the colours and the balloons by the stages because right away, I knew that I was in the right place."
